Hayfield has been a river crossing since Roman times and was also important for packhorse routes across the Pennines. It was called 'Hedfield' in the Domesday Book and was said to be a clearing in the vast King's Forest at the foot of Kinder Scout. At 636m (2,087ft), the highest point of Kinder is the highest point in the Peak District, and the southernmost point of the Pennine Mountain range.

Water-powered mills all down the valley used the abundant waters of our fast-flowing streams and rivers. With the industrial revolution, mills started to use local coal and steam engines took over from water power. The railway line enabled Kinder Reservoir to be built in 1912. It holds nearly 2,300 million litres of water - enough to fill more than 900 Olympic-sized swimming pools. Two quarries were opened to provide the stone for the dam which is 70m high. The reservoir tamed the River Sett and the Sett Valley became world renowned for its calico printing and paper manufacturing works.

Arthur Lowe (Captain Mainwaring of 'Dad's Army' fame) was born and brought up in Hayfield. It was also the home of Pat Phoenix (Elsie Tanner) and Tony Warren who reportedly created the first episodes of Coronation Street in the Lantern Pike Inn in Little Hayfield. More recently, Hayfield played host to the filming of Alan Bleasdale's 1990s TV series GBH, and the BBC1 TV series, The Village, starring John Simm, Juliet Stevenson and Maxine Peake.



In 1932, the Kinder Mass Trespass started in the village and was a key incident in the movement to open up the countryside for walkers and the establishment of the national parks.

Today Hayfield continues to be a popular destination for walkers and visitors as a gateway in the Peak District with it's gourmet public houses (some with accommodation); self-catering rural lettings and a quality campsite. It has a range of shops and facilities which include: a chemist, doctor's surgery, Post office and village store with cash facility, newsagent, chip shop, cafes, butcher, hairdresser, launderette and ironing service, and public library.



Hayfield hosts many village events throughout the year, including a May Queen Carnival, fell racing championships, Well dressings, a Pro-Locho painting competition and the Country Show and Sheepdog Trials. The bus station adjoins a large car park and also the Sett Valley Trail which is a flat 2 mile greenway route to New Mills for cyclists, horse riders and walkers. There are bus connections to Buxton, Glossop, New Mills, Stockport, and their railway stations.

The Peak & Northern Footpaths Society (PNFS) is a registered charity, founded in 1894 and run to protect the network of public rights of way, open spaces and access land in the North Midlands and the North of England.

This year, with the support of the Friends of Kinder Trespass and the Royal Hotel, PNFS celebrate the 120th anniversary of the permanent opening of the Snake Path from Hayfield to the Snake Pass Inn. 2017 is also the 85th anniversary of the 1932 Mass Trespass, making this a particularly significant anniversary for Hayfield and it's role in the long history of campaigning for access to our countryside.

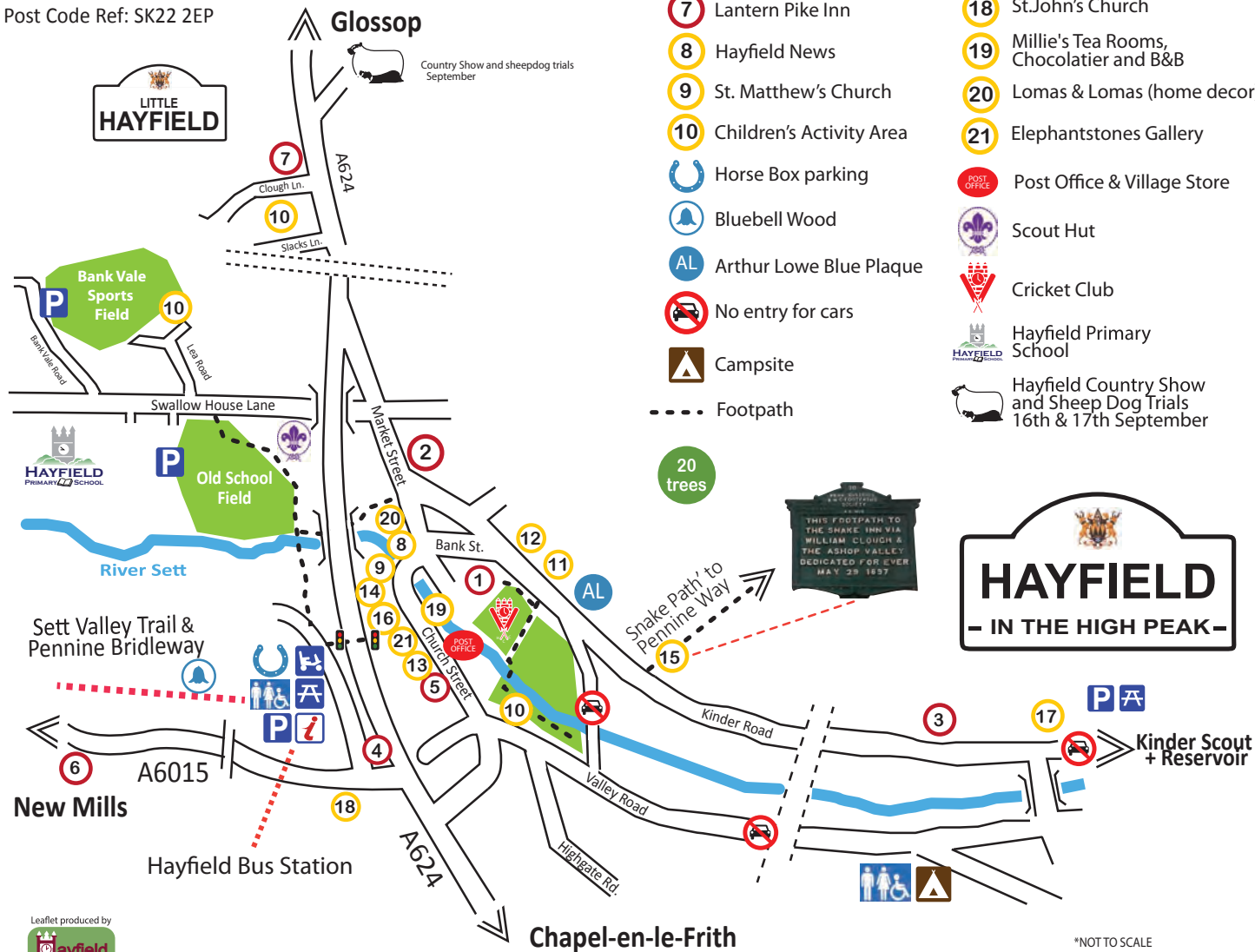
