### MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY 4th NOVEMBER 2015 IN THE VILLAGE HALL, HAYFIELD

#### 834 Public Speaking

Councillor Atkins reported:

That she has been having discussions with the Multi agency Team about the changes in personnel levels and how damaging these reductions were becoming.

D2N2, a meeting had taken place with the Chief Executive and the overriding feelings coming back are that if the County does not join then they will lose out on European Funding.

That she had resubmitted her objections to the decision to withdraw the offer of funding towards the "Entrance Project" at Hayfield. She had produced and presented a quite substantial document of evidence to support her appeal.

Councillor Ashton Reported:

That there was funding now in place for the "Crescent" project and work would start in March 2016.

The Local Plan was progressing and the inspector had asked for some amendments, when these are agreed and then signed off then the plan will be put out for consultation. The approval date is hoped to be Feb 2016.

The Council are to remove a number of "Rubbish Bring sites", including the one at Hayfield. This is because commercial waste is being dumped and that large items are being left to the side of the collection bins and removal is impossible with the normal collection vehicles.

Mentioned D2N2 and stated that a decision to opt in or out was nearing.

That he is fighting the closure of Buxton Magistrates Court as the travelling time to the replacement Court in Chesterfield is too long and impractical.

A member of the public again complained about the state of the footpaths at the Library in Hayfield and also enquired about the circulation list and coverage of the Newsletter.

#### 835 Minutes of Meetings

**It was RESOLVED** that the minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council held on 4<sup>th</sup> October 2015 and the Finance Meeting on the 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2015 were a true and fair record.

**836 PLANNING**

In addition the Chair is to consider presenting this application to the Development Control Committee in his capacity as Borough Councillor.

**837 Chairman's Announcements:**

Thanked Sustainable Hayfield for organising the "Apple Day" as it was a big success and very well attended. Councillor Clarke also informed the meeting that he has now got 15 volunteers to proceed with the various works that are needed but a meeting needs to be scheduled between Sustainable Hayfield and the Parish Council to formalise and agree the ownership details of the "Orchard Project".

Thanked the delivery volunteers of the Newsletter.

Informed the meeting that he continues to get asked for more copies of the Tourist Leaflet.

Work is to finally start at Dungeon Brow in the next week.

Made his apologies as he is unable to attend the Remembrance Day Parade and stated that Councillor Lawson is to lay the wreath for the Parish Council.

**838 Clerk's Announcements:**

Thanked the councillors who had contributed stories to the Newsletter and helped to deliver it particularly Councillor Wilson who delivered a large percentage. This run of the Newsletter was for 1000 copies and the next one will be increased to try and reach all 1230 (approx) dwellings in the Parish. The Newsletter is now currently on the Web Site.

The Parish Office had received many negative comments about the Traffic Consultation but he stated that the recommendations were only that and any final decisions will be made by DCC. Explained that the contractors had had a very busy Summer and were now entering a period of repairs and maintenance. They are both local and he believes they offer excellent value and service.

On a personal note it was now about one year since he has started at Hayfield Parish Council and he thanked everyone who had been so kind and supportive in this time.
