Hayfield is a safer place to be – thanks to The George Hotel!

Geoff Pogson, Resuscitation Officer of Tameside General Hospital and Mark Peacock Cardiac Services Ltd have donated an AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) to the Village of Hayfield. The AED is to be located centrally in the village at The George Hotel on Church Street. The Landlord and Landlady, Steve and Gill, along with their staff, have been trained in both the use of the AED and also in CPR.

A couple of months ago, Geoff and Mark also trained the Year 6 pupils of Hayfield Primary School in CPR and the use of an AED. Hopefully the Defibrillator and the CPR training will never be required in the Village but if it is, it may help save a life. Following a Cardiac Arrest, the chance of survival decreases by around 14% per minute, so the fast deployment of a Defibrillator is essential to reverse Ventricular Fibrillation, the most common cause of Cardiac Arrest and having an Automatic Defibrillator based locally can cut down the time to treatment significantly until the Emergency Services arrive.

Someone suffers from Cardiac Arrest every 2 Minutes in the UK and the placing of AED's in the community is essential in helping increase survival rates from sudden cardiac arrest. Thanks to all the staff at The George for providing this valuable service for the village.

Playgrounds

Playbark has been replaced in Valley Road and Lea Road Recreation Grounds and the skatepark has been repaired and painted. The goalposts have been reinstated in Valley Road and most of the play equipment has also been repaired. The cross scales needs more work than originally thought and this is still to be resolved. Work will continue to improve and maintain the play areas and Council thank you for your patience.
