ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY POLICY First Adopted 6th April 2022 minute 0422/11

1. Policy Statement

Hayfield Parish Council aims to carry out its activities with environmental efficiency, actively seeking to protect and enhance the local environment and biodiversity within its area of operation whilst endeavouring to ensure wider adverse environmental impact does not occur as a result.

2. Context

The Parish Council recognises that a climate emergency has been declared and acknowledged in a meeting 02.04.2019. The Parish Council will consider the impact its activities have on both climate change and biodiversity issues and will endeavour to introduce measures that either mitigate negative outcomes or actively support beneficial outcomes, where this is practicable and affordable within the resources and financial capabilities of council. The Parish Council will specifically consider the following:

1. the impact that operating its assets has on the environment,

2. the impact that the goods and services it procures, including the environmental commitment of its suppliers, has on the environment,

3. where possible and appropriate, replace environmentally inefficient assets & equipment with environmentally friendly alternatives

4. the impact that execution of the Parish Council's activities may have on the environment.

3. Aims

In all its activities the Parish Council will aim to;

1. Minimise the consumption of all resources used in its operations, particularly in respect of the buildings and equipment it uses and the administration of its activities.

2. Seek, wherever possible, to only use contractors and suppliers who have their own environmental policy, which is continually reviewed, up-dated and measured against recognised, best practice examples.

3. where possible, affordable, and commensurate with Parish Council powers and duties, support local initiatives aimed at climate change mitigation and or, biodiversity protection or enhancement. Encourage local community groups, particularly those applying for funding, to read the PC environmental policy and be available to assist when there are questions

4. Principles

Hayfield Parish Council will:

- 1. Commit to the principles of stewardship, inclusivity, integrity, and transparency and leading by example in the field of sustainability.
- 2. Regularly update and improve standards in light of increased understanding and knowledge
- 3. Commit to the sustainability and environmental elements of all relevant legislation and regulations.
- 4. Work with partners and embrace projects that promote walking, cycling and public transport to residents and visitors.
- 5. Encourage use of local and sustainable products and services, especially food.
- 6. Respect and protect natural resources by practicing conservation and good management by
 - a. Improving utility consumption through investing in energy technology (e.g. low-power street lighting) and water efficiency (e.g. finding alternatives to tap water for watering council vegetation).
 - b. Recycling and reusing waste materials where possible.
 - c. Avoid the creation of unnecessary waste by adhering to a policy of considered, strategic purchasing
- 7. Commit to the prevention of pollution, and compliance with relevant legislation and
- other requirements such as using the services of sympathetic contractors, and lighting solutions that do not cause wildlife-disturbing light pollution and disposing of all necessary waste through safe and responsible methods
- Send minimum organic waste to landfill, e.g. use compost heaps on Parish Council property for grass-cuttings, etc.
- 10. Encourage wildlife such as birds and bees via the use of suitable plants including perennials and self-seeding annuals.

- 11. Encourage Councillors and employees to take responsibility for ensuring that the best environmental policy is always used and adhered to
- 12. Signpost residents and businesses to this policy and circulate information for through the village newsletter and other partners
- 13. Introduce an environmental action framework for use by council operations and in tenders and grants and circulate with this policy as part of the funding application process

5. Review

This document was approved for use at the meeting of the Parish Council on 6th April 2022 and shall be reviewed periodically.
