

In terms of casual litter in the street, many residents have commented that the village looks extremely clean and tidy, in no small part due to the efforts of our Maintenance Assistant, Anthony Bardsley. However, we can never be complacent and so this year's Clean Up, organised by the Parish Council,



Civic Trust and Sustainable Hayfield, will target very specific locations that are in particular need of 'sprucing up'.

Phone boxes.

The Council have now acquired two Phone Boxes and will be fitting defibrillators in both of them (Kinder Road and the village box near the Council Offices). The Kinder Road box is in very good condition and will be the first to be equipped. The village centre box needs restoration work doing to it before it will become operational. Training will be offered to villagers who wish to volunteer.

Telecom Mast Developments

In July 2017, the Parish Council led and coordinated a very effective campaign against the siting of a telecom mast which would have been in a completely inappropriate site near the crossing into the village from the bus station. However, we were also aware that Hayfield would benefit

from improvements in its access to strong and reliable telecom services — so it is interesting to note that the Church of England has recently reached an agreement to use some church towers / steeples to host newly designed unobtrusive masts. Which means we might yet see improvements without the need for the old style masts which we opposed.



NEW COUNCIL PROJECTS

The Council recently agreed to allocate substantial resources to two major projects over the next financial year:

- 1. To build a new bridge giving safe access to the Pump Park area. It was brought to our notice during the construction of the Pump Park that the condition of the bridge had deteriorated over the years. It is perfectly safe for pedestrian access but needed propping during construction work so we have decided to replace it.
- 2. To invest in a new playground area in Little Hayfield. Much of the equipment there at the moment will need mending or replacing very soon, so we are going to consult with Little Hayfield Advisory Group with a view to designing a new playground from scratch.

We are also investigating the possibility of building a boules court in the village.

Street Lighting Update

Derbyshire County Council have begun installing the new street lights mentioned in our autumn issue. New LED lights, with a life of around 25 years will replace the old orange sodium bulbs, which lasted about 4 years, saving £1.2 million per year. However, some residents have raised concerns about the brightness of the lights and also that there seem to be more new lamp posts than there were previously.
